J. Neil Henderson, BA, MS, PhD is the Executive Director of the Memory Keepers Medical Discovery Team at the University of Minnesota Medical School, Duluth campus. Professor Henderson is a medical anthropologist who examines health and disease from a cross-cultural lifespan perspective among American Indian/Alaska Native populations, Spanish speakers, and African-Americans. His interest areas include the influence of cultural, socioeconomic, and political factors on health status. He published ground-breaking findings on the genetics of Alzheimer's disease in American Indians/Alaska Natives, and is an authority on providing culturally competent caregiving for elders with dementia in rural and native communities.

Dr. Henderson is a voting member of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma.
