Call for 2021 Wisconsin ADRC REC Scholar Applications

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Wisconsin Alzheimer's Disease Research Center Research Education Component (REC) Scholar Program supports exceptional junior investigators at the UW-Madison in their development into independent Alzheimer's disease (AD) researchers. This program is intended to support AD training for individual researchers and to facilitate development of skills in basic, clinical and translational research.

APPLICANTS MUST:

- Be junior faculty or advanced postdoctoral level, early stage investigators
- Have an appointment at UW-Madison
- Have a minimum of 20% protected research time to carry out project
- Have research aims that can be connected to or benefit Alzheimer's disease research and aligned with the [National Alzheimer's Project Act](#)
- Have published works, contributions to science, positions and honors

In addition:

- Applicants who have an NIH career award or similar are preferred, but this is not required
- REC support is intended primarily for US citizens and permanent residents, unless there is strong justification otherwise based on exceptional relevance to the NIH and NIA
